Note to Group Convenors:

After the AGM there will be a brief meeting of Convenors with Lorna Laxon to discuss any issues relating to the group programs and ideas for the year ahead.

Philosophy Study Group

Our first meeting is at Heron's Flight restaurant, 10:00 a.m. Wednesday, 13 February.

"Earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust", is intoned at funerals, signalling the earthly fate of the physical organisms that constitute our bodies. A few exceptions have been claimed. Elijah, for example, was said to be "taken up by a fiery chariot"; Jesus, said to have "ascendeth into heaven"; Mohammed,

according to some Islamic accounts, likewise ascended to heaven. For the rest of us, the long-term fate of our bodies is the scattering of our atoms, re-absorption of some of "our" atoms in other persons' bodies (a problem for the Christian notion of a bodily resurrection), and an ultimate sharing in whatever cosmological fate the universe has in store for itself. Survival of our physical constituents, whatever "ultimate" particles our bodies are made of, hardly counts as survival of us as persons.

But is that all there is to us as persons? Are we nothing more that physical organisms, with nothing to look forward to after bodily deaths? What about our minds? And what about our souls? People commonly use the expression "Body, mind and soul (or spirit)." Are these three different things? If not, what do "mind" and "soul/spirit" refer to? And how do they relate to our bodies? Could any of them persist after our bodily death? If so, where? And for how long?

These are some of the questions we'll discuss in 2008. And, if time allows, we may even take a look at a connected question: "Do we have a free will?" (Keeping in mind the possibility of reserving that for 2009).
